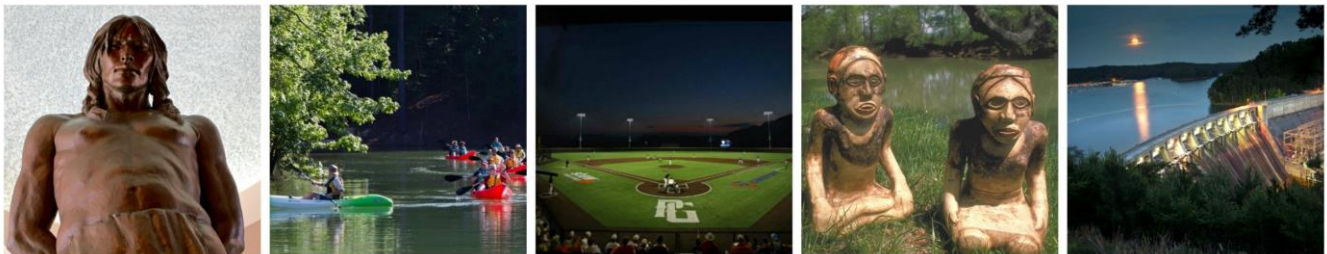

- Cartersville is home to the World's First Coca-Cola Wall Sign
- The largest camel herd in Georgia lives at Cartersville's Pettit Creek Farms
- Georgia's oldest restaurant without a telephone is Cartersville's 4-Way Lunch
- The World's Largest Know'd Junkyard – or so the sign says – is Old Car City USA
- Cartersville is the smallest town in the U.S. with two Smithsonian Affiliate Museums, and is home to the only styrofoam cup art gallery on the East Coast
- Georgia's First State Park for African Americans is George Washington Carver Park maintained by the Cartersville-Bartow CVB – just one of several points on a new Black History Trail that includes the gravesite of First Lady Michele Obama's great-great-great grandmother
